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ONLINE PROCESS

One of the greatest experiences a musician can have is to stand up and play or sing a solo for all to enjoy. In The Salvation Army, this can be a real act of worship and a blessing to others. If you've never been given the opportunity to try this for yourself, SMC is the perfect place to give it a try. All campers are eligible to participate as either or both Instrumentalist or Vocalist.

INSTRUMENTAL (Arthur Dean Instrumental Solo Award)

VOCAL Clane Lam Vocal Solo Buard).

- Choose either brass or vocal (or both if you're very motivated!)
- Rehearse the appropriate piece. For the instrumental showcase, this is Deep River. The vocal showcase piece is Take My Life I Am Yours.
- Video record your piece in one take and submit it with your instrumental or vocal stream audition recording (please save your soloist showcase recording as a separate file with the file name "Your Name Soloist Showcase")
- Our faculty will review submitted recordings and narrow it down to 3 finalists for brass and 3 finalists for vocal. Successful finalists will be notified upon their arrival at camp.
